Creating a Performing Arts Destination at Liberty Station

Cygnet Theatre and Arts District Liberty Station (NTC Foundation) have partnered to transform historic former navy Building 178 at Liberty Station into The Joan and Irwin Jacobs Performing Arts Center, a world-class performing arts venue for San Diego and a permanent home for Cygnet Theatre.

Nicknamed "The Joan" in memory of Joan Jacobs, the state-of-the-art theatre venue will house a 289-seat proscenium theatre and a 150-seat flexible, studio theatre, spacious ADA accessible seating, a rehearsal space, open-air lobby, two elegant bars, ample restrooms, and free parking.

With your support, The Joan will foster live performance, elevate the arts, and engage the San Diego community in an unparalleled cultural experience for generations. The venue will also provide jobs and training programs, encourage increased partnerships with under-resourced communities throughout the region, bring 50,000 theatre attendees each year to patronize nearby businesses, and provide two much-needed rental venues to dozens of other performing arts organizations. The venues will be accessible to individuals with disabilities, creating a theatre experience that is inclusive and welcoming to all.
